Administration Console is a tool that allows you to manage the global settings and security of SAP Build Work Zone, advanced edition, but it does not have the functionality to add business apps to the Applications menu.

Channel Manager is a tool that allows you to create and manage content providers, which are

sources of business apps and content, but it does not have the functionality to add business apps to the Applications menu. You need to use the Content Manager to add the apps from the content providers to your site.

Guided Experience enables users to learn and perform complex processes with ease and efficiency.

Content Package: This feature allows users to create and consume reusable and modular content bundles that contain UI elements, guided experiences, and workspace templates<sup>124</sup>. Content Package enables users to share and distribute content across different SAP Build Work Zone instances and environments.

The sub-workspace administrator and area administrator types do not require a role collection assignment, as they are created and managed within the SAP Build Work Zone content manager by the workspace administrator or the area administrator respectively.
